- Volunteer to run a contact point at St Joseph and St Margaret Clitherow for the Boom Community Bank.

Section 4 – Join the Hardship Group and....

....Focus on Social Inclusion – try to get those living in hardship or poverty to engage more with society even though they cannot be helped with more income.
